CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Peoples called the meeting to order and asked everyone to stand for the invocation.

INVOCATION AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Mayor Peoples lead the assembly in prayer, followed by a moment of silence in memory of the deceased members of our community.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Deputy Clerk Maurice T. Bourgeois, Jr. led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS /ANNOUNCEMENT/ ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Ryan Daul from Daul Insurance addressed the City Council concerning the property insurance that renewed on May 30, 2018. Last year's premium was \$160,755.00 and this year the renewal is \$145,217.00, a saving of \$22,538.00 which includes a decrease in deductibles. Property reevaluations are being done for 333 Fourth Street the Police Detective Bureau, 401 Fourth Street the Police Department and 410 Fourth Street the Westwego Court House. The Inland Marine Insurance also renewed at the exact premium as last year.

Mayor Peoples announced the Worley walking bridge has been removed by the Jefferson Parish School Board.

ADDRESS THE CITY COUNCIL

BETTY LANDRY - 421 SALA AVENUE

Ms. Landry gave the City Council and Mayor a copy of the Westwego Historical District Commission's Quarterly Report. Friday, July 13, 2018 will be the 20th Anniversary of the dedication of the Historic District.

WESTWEGO 1ST ANNUAL FAMILY REUNION - 118 LOUISIANA

Keisha and Jeremy spoke on behalf of the Westwego 1st Annual Family Reunion. The group addressed the City Council concerning this reunion that will take place on September 1, 2018. They have spoken with Park Director, Tiffany Jones Joseph and Council Member Green concerning the reunion. Mayor Peoples asked that they meet with Police Chief Munch for this event. Westwego Family Reunion asked for donations for this event. Mayor Peoples stated the city cannot legally give donations however, the council may donate if desired. Council Member Green spoke in favor of the event and stated it is for the entire Westwego community and he will do what he can to assist with this great event.

THU NGUYEN – 1401 WESTWEGO EXPRESSWAY

Mr. Nguyen addressed the City Council requesting an Occupational License for a hair salon at 1401 Westbank Expressway.

MOVED by Council Member Valence, and seconded by Council Member Nobles, to grant an Occupational License pending inspections.

TODD RICHARD – 202 SALA AVENUE

Mr. Richard addressed the City Council requesting the Occupational License for Vintage Lace Salon be placed back in his name.

Mr. Richard addressed the drainage problem at 202 Sala Avenue. He stated the brick walkway is holding up to a foot of water when it rains. He has put a sump pump that is draining the water to the front of the property. Council Member Nobles and Council Member Green spoke concerning this problem.

MOVED by Council Member Green, and seconded by Council Member Nobles, to allow the drain to remain at 202 Sala Avenue.

Mr. Richard stated he will place a sign at the drain area. Council Member Green asked Mr. Richard to meet with the Westwego Historical Commission concerning the details of the sign. Mayor Peoples will go and inspect this drainage problem.

JOHNNY SHADDINGER – 312 AVENUE B

Mr. Shaddinger addressed Council Member Thibodeaux concerning the swimming pool problem at 868 Avenue E. Council Member Thibodeaux stated this has been an issue for many years and is in the court system at this time. He stated he wished he would have done more during his administration concerning this swimming pool problem. Mr. Shaddinger discussed the cost of demolishing a house. He also addressed Council Member Green concerning the leash law regarding cats and thanked Council Member Green for tabling that ordinance. He also asked Council Member Green to continue his efforts to get a food bank back in Westwego.

Mayor Peoples addressed Mr. Shaddinger concerning the swimming pool problem at 868 Avenue E. Mayor Peoples stated that Mr. Shaddinger did nothing about the swimming pool in the 12 years he was in office. Mayor Peoples asked him to quit playing politics, these issues were a problem during his administration and nothing was done about them and stated we are now trying to resolve these issues. Mayor Peoples said the election is over and made note of Mr. Shaddinger's shirt he was wearing saying he is The Mayor. Mayor Peoples told him, if he truly loves Westwego, then he will become a part of the solution not a part of the problem.

JARIC KIMBLE – 614 AVENUE C

Mrs. Kimble spoke on behalf of her husband and requested a Home Occupational License for his lawn care service. Council Member Thibodeaux asked if this location will be for mail only and that no equipment will be parked at the residence. Mrs. Kimble agreed to these restrictions.

W.J. LeBlanc was present as curator for the properties.

Michelle Vidrine-Corona, CCR was present to record the hearing.

554 PATTERSON STREET

MOVED and seconded by All Council Members to open Condemnation Hearing.

The hearing for 554 Patterson Street was recorded by Michelle Vidrine-Corona, CCR.

August Daggs, Jr. and his daughter Gwendolyn Rogers were present for 554 Patterson Street.

The City Attorney entered into evidence documentation of his preparation for this hearing. He stated a notice had been sent certified mailed to the owner of record, Sarah Hammond Daggs and August Daggs at the property address.

August Daggs, Jr. was sworn in by Michelle Vidrine-Corona and questioned by City Attorney Levy. Mr. August Daggs, Jr. stated he is the son of August and Sarah Daggs which are now deceased. He has no objection to the demolishing of 554 Patterson Street.

Chief Building Inspector Leslie "Skip" Lombas was sworn in and testified regarding the condition of 554 Patterson Street. A copy of his report was entered into evidence.

Mr. Lombas discussed the condition of the property and in his opinion it cannot be repaired and recommends it be demolished. Mr. Lombas stated this property poses a hazard to the public.

Curator W. J. LeBlanc entered into evidence documentation of his efforts to contact the owners. He stated a notice had been sent certified mailed to the owner of record, Sarah Hammond Daggs and August Daggs at the property address. The certified letter was signed by August Daggs, Jr. Mr. LeBlanc asked Mr. Daggs if the family has opened succession. Mr. Daggs stated that succession has not been opened.

City Attorney Joel Levy put into evidence his research.

Mr. Daggs' daughter, Gwendolyn Rogers discussed their efforts to obtain Community Development Funds to repair the property. They have received notice that Community Development cannot help. Ms. Rogers stated Mr. Daggs' possessions are still in the house and has had considerable difficulty finding a place to live. Ms. Rogers asked for a month to remove his possessions before demolition.

Council Members and Mr. Daggs reviewed the pictures of the property. Council Member Nobles and Council Member Green stated they are willing to give them time to remove Mr. Daggs personal possessions.

Mayor Peoples invited anyone else wishing to speak on this condemnation hearing for 554 Patterson Street. No one else spoke concerning this condemnation hearing.

MOVED and seconded by All Council Members to close Condemnation Hearing.

OLD BUSINESS

1. (GG) Martin House Update

Facility Planning felt if a change order was necessary the bids may be to close. Mr. Hamid Alizadeh of APTIM and Mr. Rene Becnel with Facility Planning are working on a few details. Once completed the bid will be sent out.

2. (GG) River Road Open Ditches Update

Council Member Green expressed his concern with the open ditches on the River Road. Mayor Peoples stated the city will be responsible for the filling of the ditches. He is in the process of pricing the materials and has received the permit for this project. Representative Billiot stated the City of Westwego has received \$150,000.00 and will be receiving another \$150,000.00 from the State of Louisiana. Mr. Chris Morvant, District Administrator for District 02 with the DOT addressed the City Council. Mr. Morvant mentioned the DOT gave the permit for the filling of the ditches. The DOT will continue to look into a solution for Avenue A and Westbank Expressway however, they turned down the city's request for a red light at this location. Mr. Morvant explained the reasoning for this decision. The DOT will be repaving the River Road in the near future. Mayor Peoples is hoping the resurfacing will help with the narrow road and striping that needs to be redone on this section of the River Road. Mr. Morvant will check into getting this work done. A discussion followed. Mayor Peoples thanked Representative Billiot and Mr. Morvant for their assistance.

3. (GG) Rail Road Crossing – LA St, Sala Ave, Avenue A, Avenue B and Klein Ln

Council Member Green asked that a letter be sent to the Rail Road to inspect the tracks at the above locations. Mayor Peoples stated there is a new contact person with the Rail Road and he will be contacting that individual.

4. (JSN) Water Plant Update

Mayor Peoples and Council Member Nobles had a very informative meeting with the Louisiana Rural Water Association (LRWA). The Mayor informed the City Council the Water Plant is having more issues. The testing was to be done in April however, it has not been completed yet. Facility Planning is getting involved and Mo Selah will be representing the city.

5. (JP) Utility Adjustments

MOVED by Council Member Green, seconded by Council Member Valence, to approve the Utility Bill Adjustments as recommended.

6. (JP) Church Property

Mayor Peoples spoke to Mr. Ken Cantrelle and Liz with the Archdiocese concerning the church property. They are ready to sell to the City of Westwego for the sum of \$20,000.00 and we are responsible for the survey of the property.

MOVED by Council Member Green, seconded by Council Member Valence, to open discussion.

Mayor Peoples explained we have to do a survey and appraisal of this property. Council Member Valence asked what budget the money will come from and Council Member Nobles inquired about the ownership and survey of the property. A discussion followed. Mayor Peoples will research to see if this property can be paid through the Sala Avenue funds.

7. (JP) Cat Update

Mayor Peoples stated 54 cats have been Trap, Neuter, and Released (TNR) thus far and the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter will continue with this process. The Mayor announced to the public he placed an article concerning feral cats on the back table for the public to review.

8. (JP) Vic A Pitre Drainage Canal

Paul Johnston and the Mayor has been working with the Vic A Pitre Drainage Canal. Mitchell Theriot's Representative, Council Member Rivere and Mayor Peoples met to inspect the drainage canal. They will be addressing some issues now but hope to have the replacement of the old pump, removal of the two bridges, and repairs on the canal in the future.

9. (JP) 801 Avenue A

Mayor Peoples addressed the burnt structure at Avenue A and 7th Street. The Mayor would like to begin the condemnation proceedings for this property.

MOVED by Council Member Rivere, seconded by Council Member Thibodeaux, to begin condemnation proceedings for 801 Avenue A.

10. (JP) Water System

LRWA assisted in locating a water line by National Gypsum that helps feed water to Kass Brothers and Kinder Morgan. They will be returning to perform a sewer smoke test for no charge. The Mayor will be sending two employees to Lake Charles next week to attend one of the LRWA Classes.

NEW BUSINESS

1. (GG) Drainage at 200 Block of Avenue B

Council Member Green asked Mr. Henry Quintinilla to speak concerning the drainage problem at the 200 block of Avenue B. The Mayor will be inspecting this drainage problem.

2. (GG) 301 & 305 Fourth Street

MOVED by Council Member Green, seconded by Council Member Thibodeaux, to do inspection to begin condemnation proceedings for 301 and 305 Fourth Street.

4. (JP) EMS Millage Election

Mayor Peoples read a notice for the EMS Millage Election. The Mayor wants the public to be aware that the EMS Millage will be on the Saturday, December 8, 2018 election ballot.

5. (JP) Sewer Lift Stations

Mayor Peoples spoke of the major problems at Louisiana Street and Westbank Expressway. He asked for a motion to repair the sewer lift station under an emergency situation as per the recommendation of CPA Jim Butler. Mr. Butler informed the Mayor, because this is an emergency situation it does not require public bid.

MOVED by Council Member Green, seconded by Council Member Nobles, to open discussion.

APPROVED: Yeas: Green, Nobles, Valence, Rivere, Thibodeaux

Mayor Peoples would like to use the BP money for this emergency repair. Council Member Nobles would like to see if this can come from the sewer loan the city is in the process of receiving. The Mayor suggested the money come from the allotted funds from Paul Johnston. The lift station will be placed above ground for a cost of approximately \$100,000.00. All Council Members agree this repair must be done. Council Member Valence asked that the five Council Member be informed when there is an emergency. Mayor Peoples stated he will email or send a group text to notify the Council. Mayor Peoples was under the impression that Council Member Rivere informed the City Council. Council Member Rivere did inform some of the Council Members on Monday afternoon. Council Member Nobles asked the City Attorney Joel Levy the protocol for emergency situations, he was under the impression a special meeting must be called within 3 days. City Attorney Levy will research the protocol for emergency situations.

MOVED and seconded by All Council Members to declare an emergency regarding the sewer lift station at Louisiana Street and Westbank Expressway.

3. Outsource NOLA

Mayor Peoples and Council Member Valence met with Jamie Gonzales from Outsource NOLA. Ms. Gonzales has been working on our new website and regaining our domain. Council Member Valence feels we need someone to handle the posting on Facebook and our website. Outsource NOLA will be doing an email database which will be a onetime fee of \$1,700.00 and recovering of the domain for the sum of \$500.00. Outsource NOLA will be charging a \$700.00 monthly fee for marketing and advertising on Facebook and our web page. Outsource NOLA will commit to five post a week and two videos, they will touch on all organizations and events of the city. Also included in this is an email newsletter to our citizens. Council Member Valence ask that this be tried for 6 months and the funds come the Tourist Information Center.

MOVED by Council Member Valence, seconded by Council Member Thibodeaux, to approve six month trial with Outsource NOLA and continue working on the email database and recovering the domain.
