#### RESOLUTIONS FOR ADOPTION

A resolution approving a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the Parish of Jefferson and the City of Westwego to provide funding at a cost not to exceed \$100,000.00 towards the design of a safe pedestrian walkway from Sala Avenue over the levee to a dock along the Mississippi River as a part of an initiative to revive the City of Westwego's dock, to promote tourism, and to provide additional recreational facilities for the citizens of the City of Westwego and of the Parish of Jefferson.

A resolution requesting that the required local match for the Safe Streets and Roads for All grant recently awarded to the City of Westwego by the United States Department of Transportation be waived due to the City's status as a Disadvantaged Community under the Justice40 Initiative.
